Is A Dog License Required?

Yes, by state law all dogs, 5 months or older are required to have a valid, current year dog license attached to their collar. Licenses are good for the calendar year, January 1 to December 31.

What Do I Need To Get A Dog License?

You need to provide a copy of your dog's current Certificate of Rabies Vaccination, a self addresses stamped envelope if requested by mail, and your payment. A license application form is included with your tax statement. Renters who are dog owners are required to have their dogs licensed. Contact the treasurer for an application.

Garbage/Recycling Information

Dumpsters are open for household garbage on Saturdays from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM and May 1 to September 30 on Wednesday evenings from 5:30 to 7:30 PM. There is a charge of \$2.50 per bag of garbage. Recycling is free to town residents.

Where Is The Garbage/Recycling Center?

Both are located at the Town Hall. It is located at 398 Highway 128

When Are the Town Board Meetings

First Monday of the month at 7:30 PM at the Town Hall. Because of Labor Day, the September meeting is held the first Tuesday of the month.

How Do I Get A Burn Permit?

Permits are required for any fire. Contact the Town Chairman, Town Clerk or the Town Treasurer. Burn permits are good from January 1 to December 31. There is no charge for the permit.

How Do I Get A Building Permit?

Contact the Building Inspector BEFORE any work is started. Contact information is below.

Reminder Regarding Mailboxes and Snow Removal

Mailboxes installed in the Town right of way are placed at the owner's risk. Each mailbox should be sufficiently solid to withstand snow-clearing operations. It is the property owner's responsibility to clear snow around the mailboxes to assure mail delivery by the U.S. Postal Service.

Snow plow operators are very cautious near mailboxes. In most cases a properly installed mail box will permit a snow plow wing to clear snow from under it. Most cases of damaged mailboxes are due to heavy snow hitting the mailbox. The mailbox is seldom hit by the plow.

When plowing your driveway, Wisc. Statute 346.94(5) prohibits anyone from placing or causing to be placed upon a roadway any foreign substance which may be injurious to any vehicle. This prohibits anyone from plowing, shoveling or blowing snow onto the road. You **may not** plow driveway snow across the road to the ditch. The penalty for violating this statute is \$50 for each offense. Additionally, section 86.022 makes it a misdemeanor punishable by fine to place any obstruction in a road ditch which will impede drainage.

Requests to have your driveway plowed need to be made through a board member or the Clerk. Calls are not to be made to the town road patrolman.
